



Impact of HIV Disease and Treatment on an Aging Population



Through the Corporate Grants program, Gilead supports the efforts of community-based organizations, public health entities and similar umbrella organizations to educate their constituents and healthcare providers about the impact of HIV treatment on an aging HIV-positive population. Specifically, Gilead is looking to support organizations focused on understanding the challenges of individuals aged 50 years and older with chronic HIV, including the accumulated risk of comorbidities and the impact of long-term infection, treatment and lifestyle factors.

Selection Criteria

Gilead encourages proposals from organizations that can demonstrate the following:

- Ability to clearly state how "underserved" populations (individuals 50 years and older living with HIV) will be reached through clearly defined goals and milestones.
- A focus on novel ways to determine or discover policies and interventions that should be considered and implemented for individuals requiring long-term access to HIV services and other health services, beyond suppressing viral load.

Eligibility

- Organizations must be classified as a not-for-profit and headquartered in the United States with an interest in public health, including but not limited to providing social services, education or advocacy for "underserved" or "hard to reach" populations.

Application Process

- Applications are accepted on a continual basis. Decisions are typically communicated within 12 weeks from the submission date.
